Willie Cole, born in 1955, is a creator with fluent command of symbolism. Having heard of him maybe twenty years ago, I had the privilege to meet the artist and acquire one of his amazing works, a bronze sculpture with one of his signature motifs: *shoes*. I loved the shoe style so much that I purchased another. I thought carefully about this because at the time, my gallery was closed and no money was coming in. Yet, it proved to be a prime opportunity to acquire such strong works. Over the years, these works have held anchor positions in a number of our exhibitions and catalogues - a testament to the artist's aesthetic creativity and historic significance. To only call Cole a contemporary artist would be unjust, he is indeed a brilliant creator of objects, a visionary of his genre.
